Oreo Persuasive Writing

Persuasive writing is a type of opinion writing. Your opinion is what you think, feel, or believe about something. When we persuade someone, we want to convince them that our opinion is right. A strong persuasive essay should address a topic that some people may disagree with.

Use the acronym OREO to help you remember the structure of a persuasive essay.

Opinion: Tell the reader how you feel about the topic.

Reasons: State some reasons that support your opinion.

Examples: Give 1-3 examples, with details, that prove why you're right.

Opinion: Restate your opinion in a different way, with feeling!

Now, try it! Do you think kids should be able to use cell phones in school?


